Outputs	 Original target The improvements of a 8 km canal towpath at Cromford - 4km of actual works 	 Achieved 4.68km works to towpath enabling 8km of towpath improvements.
Headlines/added value	The work enhanced access for walkers, cyclists, pushchair and wheelchair users, providing a 2.5m width route along a 450m stretch of canal linking the Cromford canal winding hole opposite Lea Wood pump house to the Visitor Centre at High Peak Junction.	
Outcomes	Following a consultation to establish what types of information people would like to have on arrival and how they would like it presented, the consensus of those involved (FoCC, DWT, DCC) is to replace the current traditional style interpretation boards with more visual orientation boards and notice boards where activity/event posters can be displayed. The Arkwright Society have already started with this approach and as part of their reinterpretation package for visitor experience.
