Project Summary	The Derwent Valley Mills World Heritage Site (DVMWHS) is stretched out along the Derwent Valley, and managed by many different organisations. This means that visitors can come away with many different messages without clearly understanding the significance of the Valley and how it changed the world. Through this project we wanted to give the partners an opportunity to step back and consider how their places fit into the overall story of the Valley. We also wanted to produce some interpretation exploring the overarching theme that worked across a number of sites. We chose the online Wonders of the Peak app for this.

Lessons Learnt	Through the Wonders of the Peak platform we have created examples of interpretation working across sites to support the DVMWHS overarching interpretative theme. The consultation workshop showed a good degree of common ground in the understanding of the benefits and challenges of being a partner in the DVMWHS. This is an ongoing challenge for the DVMWHS and needs some sustained work to embed. Ideally this project would have been initiated earlier in the scheme for DerwentWISE to make a more substantial impact with.
