

Create your family crest







How this links with the Derwent Valley Mills World Heritage Site:

This activity looks at your personal heritage, are you born and bred Derbyshire? Or have you adopted this beautiful county as your own? All the important families had their own family crest, use this activity to create your own that will be unique to you and your family.

You will need:

- Paper
- Pencils
- Watercolour paints
- Pen (optional)
- Jar of Water






How to have a go:	
Step 1 – Draw a basic shield shape.	
Step 2 – Divide into different sections.	
I have chosen diagonals, but you could go across or down.	
Step 3 – Chose where to place your name.	
I chose to put the letters from the Derwent Valley World Heritage Site across the bottom, you could use a mixture of first names, or family surnames.	The same of the sa


Step 4 – Choose a flower to represent your family.

I chose the Derbyshire flower from the flag as this crest is to represent our county. You could chose a family favourite, a flower that means something to you, a flower that is a memory of an event, or even make your own up.




Step 5 – Choose objects or activities that represent your family.

I chose to use the Canal Boat, Birdswood, The Water Wheel and The Silk Mill because they are important images for the Derwent Valley. You could choose favourite activities, objects that are important, favourite places to visit or even where you live.



Step 6 - Add in some colour.

Use your watercolour paints to carefully add in some colour, choose which colours represent your family best – does everyone have a favourite colour they would like to choose?



Keep adding colour to make your family crest unique and bright.



Step 7 - Optional

Go over the lines with a black pen, you may want to leave the lines off, it's personal preference, I like the black lines. I also coloured the background with pencil once all the paint had dried.
