We are interested to hear from artists and creative practitioners with a strong connection to the Derwent Valley Mills World Heritage Site area and who have project ideas that could animate the Birdswood Canal Boat. The boat will be located at Cromford Canal Basin for a one off pop-up event, as part of the Discovery Days Festival. The aim of the project is to explore creative ways of using the Birdswood and engage new audiences in the Derwent Valley Mills World Heritage Site.

Proposed art forms could include (but are not limited to): light, installation, performance, music, sound or work which is interactive or uses new technologies.

It is essential that:

- the content of the work responds to the Derwent Valley Mills World Heritage Site
- proposals take the logistics of the site in consideration ie. The Birdswood boat moored next to the Gothic Warehouse
- the project is 'pop-up' and animates the space in an innovative way
- the project is appropriate for a range of audiences

- Overview of your interests/practice or a CV and a small selection of relevant images of previous work.
- Any visuals that could provide us with an insight into your proposed work plus any relevant web links please limit size of pdf to no more than 3MB.

About Derwent Valley Mills World Heritage Site

The Derwent Valley Mills World Heritage Site is a place that changed the world. It is a place where the dramatic power of the landscape was harnessed through human ingenuity, leading to industrial developments that revolutionised the way people worked and lived. Derwent Valley Mills was inscribed a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2001.

Arts organisation Beam have been appointed as Creative Producer to lead on a contemporary arts programme as part of the DVMWHS Great Place programme.

The activities are funded as a Great Place Scheme, a partnership between the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF), Arts Council England and supported by Historic England.
