Project Summary	This project was designed to engage people practically with stone and lime. It compromised of a comprehensive series of linked modules exploring briefly geological origins, understanding stone in the landscape, buildings, making use of NSC's national building stone reference collection, but concentrated on basic skills in stone with a particular emphasis on conservation – dry stone walling/ masonry/ stone conservation and repair/carving and sculpting/use of lime, sourcing and matching
